



- Provide collection services to 35 central points
 5 central points (\$700)
 15 central points (\$2,250)

- Battery sorting, placing masking tape over batteries, record the weight of batteries (\$0.4 per rechargeable battery)

Rechargeable Battery Waste in Hong Kong

- About 200 tonnes from domestic sources and 50 tonnes from industrial/ commercial/ institutional sources disposed of at landfills each year.
- EPD have approached the major battery waste producers since June 2005.
- Working group agreed to expand the programme to take C&I battery waste for recycling.

Industrial/Commercial Battery Waste

 Agreed to set the charge as shown. The waste producers also require to pay local collection cost.

Results (Apr 05 – Feb 06)



- About 5.2 tonnes of rechargeable batteries are collected from the community in the first 10.5 months (recovery rate : 2.5%) and 4.5 tonnes were collected from the industrial sector. The total recovery rate is 4.5%.
- The programme aims to achieve a recovery rate of 10% in 2 years


Collection Rate of Battery from Domestic sector (as at 15.2.06)






Cumulative Weight of Battery Collected from Domestic and C & I sectors (as at 15.2.2006)






Types of Batteries Collected in the Bins (as at 15.2.06)






Rechargeable Batteries Collected by Types (as at 15.2.06)

First Shipment – 11.4.06



 Up till now, there are totally 12 tonnes of rechargeable batteries being stored in the Chemical Waste Treatment Centre. About 45% (by weight) are collected from community and 55% (by weight) are collected from industrial sectors.



Survey Findings – Awareness of the Programme






The survey on Mobile Phone Battery Recycling Programme conducted in 2002 showed that awareness level is only 23%.


Survey Findings -Ways to know the programme






Survey Findings -Awareness of the collection points






Survey Findings – Where do people find the collection point



Survey Findings – Intention to recycle rechargeable batteries







Survey on Mobile Phone Battery Recycling Programme conducted in 2002 showed that the supportive level is 95%.





Nikon相機充電池全球回收

【本報訊】攝影發燒友常以相機為伴,但可用於部 分藝康(Nikon)單鏡反光相機的充電式鋰離子電池EN-EL3,曾因過熱着火,全球共發生四宗意外,幸無人受 傷。現時全球共售出71萬枚EN-EL3,藝康昨日展開回收 行動,免費更換問題電池。

EN-EL3短路着火 釀4意外

藝康昨日公布,適用於D100、 D70、D70S及D50單鏡反光相機的 充電式鋰離子電池EN-EL3,可能會 出現短路,導致電池過熱,甚至會着 火,全球因此發生過四宗意外,但無 人受傷。


藝康現正提供自願性回收及更換 計劃,回收的電池生產批號以44A, 46A,47A,48A,49A,4AA,4BA或 4CA作開始,其餘同款電池不在回收 之列。 美國消費者產品安全委員會(CPSC)指出,在中國 製造的EN-EL3,全球已售出了71萬枚,建議用者應立即 停止使用這款電池。

藝康香港市場部經理符致鑫表示,首宗意外在美國 發生,亞洲暫時未有意外紀錄,相信是生產程序出現瑕


